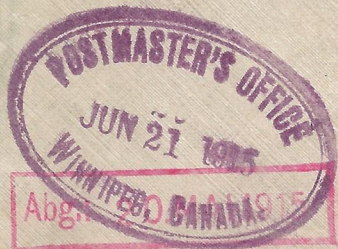

Dear Ethel

[What did you think I wonder when you heard that I made my way to Germany so quickly. It was a great fight however in which the Canadian Division was sacrificed to another big movement. I do not know a thing that has happened since I was captured as we get no British Papers.] When you send me money, (if you have not sent me any already) you had better send it to Uncle Fred at Tamworth as it will be easier for him to send it to me. I'm writing you please remember that I received your letter saying that the case was finished.

but that no decision had been given. So let me have a good long letter. I suppose it will not reach me till the end of June.

[I hope the war ends very quickly as this prison camp life is very monotonous.]

[The Germans treat us very well but the very fact of being unable to leave our enclosure is enough to keep us thinking.]

I wrote Agnes last week and

as [I am only allowed to write 2 letters and 2 cards per month

and I have to get food from England. I cannot write often] so tell her you heard from me

In case my letter to her miscarried
 please send me, 2 suits of B.V.D
 underwear size 42, some handkerchiefs
 blue dot border, send me some of my
 own if I left any at home. A
 good leather belt. a couple or
 three light shirts negligee, I
 think I left some at home

I am sure that you do not
 have to pay postage to us here
 I know they do not from England

In that case why you can send
 me parcels whenever you want to.

If you will write to

 E. M. book blemarimus B. b. Van Island
 write them that I am in a
 position where I cannot write them
 but would be glad to get a letter.

Phone Mr. Barcaran Belkirk Ave. Y.M.C.A.
 Also Mr. Hadacks. [The weather —
 here in Germany is not very
 warm yet but what trees I can
 see are nice and green while
 the fruit trees are in blossom.]

[Tell Barcaran that I
 am the parson for my section
 of the camp which is some
 job.] Remember me to the
 carries, sidebottoms, [and
 all engineering friends] [I am
 very well and have been very
 lucky to escape with my life all
 safe and sound, I left many friends dead
 in the trenches, I believe only a small
 handful are left alive of my battalion.
 Now good by and God keep you.]
